Village of Deferiet

Scenic Rt 3 (Proposed as Alternative Byway Route Loop)

Resources are located between NYS DOT Start/End Mile Point Jefferson County 10.95 through 11.88

Located in northern Jefferson County in the Town of Wilna along Route 3, the village like neighboring communities developed around its bountiful natural resources of wood and water along the Black River.

The last big paper mill erected on the Black River was the St. Regis Paper Mill at Deferiet with operations beginning in 1901 as investors capitalized upon the high cost of newsprint around the turn of the 20th century. The location of Deferiet along the Black River provided investors with an opportunity to control low water levels during the summer season with the construction of a canal to divert water from the dam to allow year-round operations at the mill, a significant feat for its time. The company was sold in 1916 to wealthy investors, who invested heavily into the plant and village. By 1922 the village was a company owned municipality with approximately 1,500 residents living in company owned houses. During the mid-late 1960's the company sold the houses. Today few residents work at the plant due to a reduction in operations. Deferiet serves mainly as a bedroom community to neighboring communities.
