Five Steps to Jump Start Your Cybersecurity Program April 27

Watertown, NY - The risks are real, so why is it so challenging for small to medium-sized organizations to get a cybersecurity program off the ground? In this session at 7 pm, Tuesday April 27, Steven Gravel, Cybersecurity Support Liaison at the NYS Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services, will explore a few of the cyber risks faced by the local government, healthcare and education sectors. He will also tackle some of the roadblocks organizations can encounter when trying to make headway in mitigating these risks, and how to get around them. While cybersecurity can be complex and technical, this webinar will stay (mostly) out of the weeds, instead focusing on strategy and guiding principles.
