Tug Hill Commission Community Connectedness Survey Launched

Watertown, NY – Are residents moving out of your community? Do boards and community groups have difficulty finding volunteers? Do you feel connected to other people in your community and Tug Hill?

Research shows that communities are at their best when residents feel connected to each other and feel invested in each other's welfare. The Tug Hill Commission, a regional task force, and the University of Albany invite Tug Hill residents, homeowners and visitors to complete a short survey at tinyurl.com/tughill-community. The findings from this survey can benefit our community members by identifying any gaps that prevent a strong sense of belonging. The findings will be shared publicly and will inform efforts to improve how residents, homeowners and visitors feel about the community.

It is important that we hear from people who feel well-connected and from those who do not; even if some might have a strong support system within the Tug Hill region, others may not and may contemplate leaving Tug Hill. This survey aims to answer the questions "what makes some people stay in the region" and "what makes others leave."
