

ABOUT US

The American Tree Farm System is NOT about Christmas trees, although some of our members grow Christmas trees... The Tree Farm System is NOT about monoculture tree plantations or genetically engineered nonnative tree programs! We are about the sustainment and promotion of our native, working forest!

Today's Tree Farm program is sponsored by the American Forest Foundation (AFF), AFF is a landowner-managed nonprofit organization dedicated to the working forest concept and the stewardship of sustainably managed forests. AFF is advised by leading foresters and other environmental specialists and funded through grass roots, private, and corporate donations. On a state level, each Tree Farm program is locally sponsored and managed by a state Tree Farm Committee.

HISTORY OF AMERICAN TREE FARM

To test their fire control and reforestation theories, the Weyerhaeuser Timber Company set aside 120,000 acres near Montesano, Washington, for experimentation in 1940. On June 12, 1941, that tract of land was dedicated as the first official tree farm. Named for local logger Charles H. Clemons, the Clemons Tree Farm became the first in a succession of privately owned forest lands certified for growing trees as a crop and practicing forest management on a sustainable basis. The resulting tree farm program was quickly adopted around the country. By the end of 1941, the National Lumber Manufacturers Association (NLMA) set up a national tree farm program and charged its subsidiary, the American Forest Product Industries (AFPI), with managing the program.

In 1946, AFPI became an independent organization and retained the tree farm program. Over the next seventy years, the American Tree Farm System (ATFS) would be overseen by several organizations that succeeded AFPI: the American Forest Institute (1968–1986), the American Forest Council (1986–1993), and the American Forest Foundation, or AFF (1993–present).



A TREE FARM IS A PRIVATELY OWNED FOREST THAT IS MANAGED FOR WOOD, WATER, WILDLIFE, AND RECREATION. LANDOWNERS DETERMINE THE ASPECTS THAT ARE TO BE EMPHASIZED. ADDITIONAL BENEFITS INCLUDE IMPROVED HABITAT, WATERSHED PROTECTION, OUTDOOR RECREATION, AND AESTHETIC VALUES.

TO BECOME A CERTIFIED TREE FARM A FOREST MUST:

- 1. Be a minimum of 10 acres (excluding homestead) and a maximum of 20,000 contiguous acres
- 2. Be privately owned
- 3. Meet <u>AFF STANDARDS</u>, which includes having an acceptable Forest Management Plan
- 4. Successfully pass an inspection of forest activity progress, based on the activities outlined in your FMP, every 5 years or less if property is selected for random sampling inspection







This stand is a northern hardwood stand with small sawtimber in the overstory comprised of the more typical Northern Hardwood species such as Soft Maple, Hard Maple, Black Cherry, and American Beech. The dominant species is Soft Maple, making up nearly 40% of the stocking. The basal area of the stand is 110 square feet/ acre. Eastern Hemlocks can also be found within the stand growing on wetter sites along with Yellow Birch and Aspen. Deer have been spotted all over the stand along with their tracks and bedding sites. The stand is also home to wild porcupine who find shelter in holes in the ground generated by windthrown trees and who feed on the bark of the surrounding trees.

- Graduate of and SAF certified forestry program, like Ranger School, ESF, Paul Smith's, Morrisville, etc.
- Classes in: Dendrology, Forest Ecology, Soils, Forest Management, Forest Measurements, Forest Policy and Administration
- Successfully complete the Certified Training Program on-line
- NY Tree Farm inspectors are well-versed in the regional forest conditions and markets and have years of experience in the forestry profession
- NY Tree Farm inspectors are all consulting foresters working in the private sector or have worked in the private sector for several years.

FAMILY FOREST CARBON PROGRAM
