The Problem

- Municipalities stockpile woodchips



The Solution

- Silt Sock Auger Bucket



Better than Silt Fences

- Prevent stormwater runoff
- Keep sediment on construction sites
- Allow water to pass through
- Applications



From Wood Chips to Compost Socks

- Fill the hopper bucket attached to a skid-steer with a load of wood chips



From Wood Chips to Compost Socks

- Wood chips are pushed through the hopper with an auger



From Wood Chips to Compost Socks

- Staff then use a hog tie to secure the end before cutting



From Conversation to Watershed Protection Program

- \$1.00 per foot for landowners and contractors
- Free to municipalities
- Stormwater pollution prevention for public and private landowners
